



Specialty Camp Search and Recovery



Your favorite Ray Ban sunglasses fall overboard! You jump in and look for them, but you can't find them. What do you do? Take this camp and you will learn how to organize and plan an underwater search, what patterns to use for different types of lost objects, and how to retrieve both small and large objects underwater. Students will also learn how to tie knots such as the bowline the sheet bend and hitches as well as how to properly use a lift bag. In this camp, students will review skills in the pool, do three shore dives and two boat dives with a total of five Open Water Dives! Upon successful completion of this course, students will receive the PADI Search & Recovery Diver certification. This specialty counts toward the PADI Master Scuba Diver rating, the highest rating in non-professional recreational scuba diving.

Master Scuba Diver Rating:

The Master Scuba Diver rating is the highest PADI designation in non-professional recreational diving. To achieve this rating, divers must complete the following certifications: Open Water, Advanced Open Water, Rescue Diver, and 5 Specialties. In addition, divers must have at least 50 logged dives. When completing this rating with Jack's Diving Locker, recipients have their names engraved in a plaque to honor their achievement.

All courses include instruction by PADI certified Instructors and Divemasters. All camps follow PADI course outlines. PADI is the Professional Association of Diving Instructors -- the world's largest scuba certification agency. Cancellations must be made 72 hours or more in advance or charge will be incurred. Minimum 3, Maximum 6 students.

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
